Correspondence: "I am the 3rd Great Granddaughter of Samuel D. and Louisa Higgins Clark. Samuel is buried in Clark's Mills Associated Cemetery and directly next to him is his son Charles Osro Clark, both served in Co.K, 19th WI Vol Infantry and have civil war markers by their graves. Just in front of their graves is a lone gravestone labeled L. Clark. I would like to try to find out if this is Samuel's wife Louisa. Is there a sextant who has the records for the Clark family cemetery? The cemetery is located on land once owned by Ira Clark, Samuel D. Clark's brother. Any information you could give me on this L. Clark grave would be greatly appreciated.

Thank you so much for checking on the grave information. I have attached photos of the first 3 graves in the first row of the cemetery as you enter from the drive. These are the graves of Samuel D. Clark, L. Clark and Charles Osro Clark. As you can see the stones only list their military company, no dates. The L. Clark is the one I would

Forgot to mention that the photo I sent was taken after my Dad tried to get the stone for Samuel D. Clark back into the ground. You can see in the lower left hand corner where the stone was hit by something and a big chunk taken out of the corner. The stone is cracked below ground level. We were able to set it upright, but this photo was taken in May of 2003. I have not been there since so can't tell you if the stone is still standing or not.
