Der Nord Westen, 24 July 1890
(From the correspondent in Two Rivers, 22 July)

"Last week CHARLES DIEDRICH, LOUISE DIEDRICH, and MARIE DIEDRICH, came up from Chicago to visit their elderly father who is quite ill here in Two Rivers. They returned to Chicago yesterday. Old Mr. DIEDRICH has crossed much ground during his life. He served 3 yrs. in the Civil War, making Sherman's famous march to the sea and spending a period of time in a Confederate prison camp. He has been trying for years to get a pension, but so far "Uncle Sam" has not granted one."

Der Nord Westen, 28 Aug. 1890:
(From correspondent in Two Rivers, 26 Aug.) "In response to a telegram advising him of his father's death, CHARLES DIEDRICH



arrived here last evening and his sisters LOUISE and MARIE are expected today. His father was CARL L. DIEDRICH who had lived in New York before coming here where he worked in the chair factory."

Der Nord Westen, 21 February 1895: "Mrs. Louise Dietrich in Two Rivers has been granted a pension."

Der Nord Westen, 07 Mar. 1895: (From the correspondent in Two Rivers, 04 Mar.) "Mrs. Carl Diedrich has finally been awarded a pension. Her husband died almost 4 yrs. ago and she has been petitioning for the pension ever since. Mr. Diedrich served over 3 yrs. during the war and was part of Sherman's great March."
