"Death Fri. in Kiel of 74-yr. old Mrs. Carl Eller. Her death is attributed directly to the severe cold weather of the last week. She and her husband were found in bed one morning half dead from the cold. Their age and circumstances left them without means to deal with the terrible cold weather. In addition to her husband, the deceased leaves a daughter living in Chicago and a son in Milwaukee who practices law."
