Plymouth Post, January 7, 1903: Kiel-Adam Glock, a pioneer of Town Schleswig died at the Soldier's Home in Milwaukee where he had been for 2 1/2 years from an intestinal infection. He was born on September 7th 1833 in Niersrein, Hessen Darmstadt, Germany and lived to be 69 years of age. He came to America in 1848 and Sheboygan, then in Franklin and then he started a business in Milwaukee. In 1857 he was married to Catherine Gerlack who died in 1899. He is survived by 6 children, one brother, Friederick Glock of Town Rhine and one sister. The funeral is Monday at the Rockville Cemetery with Pastor Rech officiating.
