Der Nord Westen, 25 Apr. 1907, from the correspondent in St. Nazianz, 16 Apr.:

"Death here on March 27 of Mrs. Geneveva (sic) Heizmann at age 78 of dropsy."

Der Nord Westen, 20 Feb. 1908, from the correspondent in St. Nazianz, 18 Feb.)

"Death on the 14th of old settler and veteran Virgel (sic) Heizmann at age 78.

For years Mr. and Mrs. Heizmann, a childless couple, have closed themselves

off from the community and were seldom seen. Mrs. Heizmann died about a year ago."

Virgil -husband of Genovefa nee Guenter and an Oschwald Brother

(Jan. 31, 1828-Feb. 13, 1908 -husband of Genovefa -parents marked "unknown" on death record -workman -born Baden -arrived in New York on the ship Zurich from Havre, France on July 23, 1855 -service in the Union Army during the Civil War died from "cancer of stomach" and "tricuspid regurgitation")

Roman Catholic Religious Society area of Section Two

Genovefa -wife of Virgil -daughter of Bernard and Ursula Guenter -born Baden -arrived in New York on the ship New York from Havre, France with Fr. Oschwald on Aug. 1, 1854 -traveled with her parents and 3 siblings -died from "kidney disease and dropsy") -Roman Catholic Religious Association Area of cemetery
