Born: 1833 in Norway

Enlisted: September 30, 1864 as a Private from Newton, WI, 36 year-old Farmer.  
Mustered Out: June 2, 1865

Der Nord Westen, June 6, 1878: Death last Mon. of Theodor Jahn, an old settler who 14 days ago lost the little finger of the right hand in an accident, but did not act until it was too late to do anything. He was buried yesterday and leaves a wife and 3 children.

Der Nord Westen, 25 January 1894: "A pension has been awarded to Mrs. Catharine Jahn."
