Der Nord Westen, 01 Feb. 1894: "Death of farmer Michael Kleemann, assessor of Town Manitowoc, early last Sat. at his residence on Town Line in Town Manitowoc. He had been a resident of this county for 38 yrs., reached the age of 65 yrs. and had been ill for a long time. The funeral took place Mon. morning at the Catholic Cemetery, and the local G.A.R. Post participated."

Taken from a bio. Sketch of M. C. Kleman, a son, from "History of Manitowoc County Wisconsin" by Dr. L. Falge, 1911-1912, v.2, p.241-242: "Michael and Katherine (Schwartzzenbarth) Kleman. Michael came from Germany to Kossuth in 1855 where he purchased a farm of forty acres, which at that time was practically unimproved land. He developed it and later disposed of it before purchasing a farm near Manitowoc, on which he lived until the time of his death. During the Civil war he served as a volunteer in Company D, Sixth Wisconsin Volunteer Infantry. He was honorably discharged at the close of the war after having been incarcerated in Libby Prison. In politics he was a democrat and served as assessor of Kossuth for seven terms. He was also treasurer of Manitowoc for four years and served here as assessor for several years. His death occurred on the 27th of January, 1894, and he is interred in Calvary cemetery."
