1st WI Infantry, Company D

Born: March 3, 1845

Enlisted: September 25, 1861 as a Private, from Milwaukee, WI.

Wounded: Date and place not stated

Mustered Out: October 14, 1864

1875-76 Manitowoc (Pryor & Co) City Directory: Maguire Richard, basket maker, resides 6th south of St. Clair

1890 Veterans Schedule, Manitowoc County: Richard Maguire, 5 A; Lameness in back/ caused by chronic diarrhea

Der Nord Westen, 8 January 1891: "Richard Maguire of Manitowoc was awarded a pension today."

1895 June 20 Veterans Census of Manitowoc County: Richert Maguire, Pvt D 1 Infantry, post office Manitowoc

Der Nord Westen, 12 June 1902: "The pension of veteran Richard Maguire has been raised to \$10 a month."

Der Nord Westen, 6 August 1903: "The pension of veteran Richard McGuire here has been raised to \$12 a month."

Died: February 13, 1907

Buried: Evergreen Cemetery, Manitowoc, WI

Gravesite:

Der Nord Westen, 14 Feb. 1907: "Richard McGuire, a well-known resident of our city in which he has been a resident since 1869, died yesterday after an illness of only a few days with pneumonia. The deceased was born 05 March 1844 in England and came to America as a child. At the outbreak of the Civil War he joined the 1st Wisconsin Infantry Regiment and served 4-1/2 years. After the war he went first to Milwaukee, then to Manitowoc. He is survived by a widow but no children. The funeral will be held Saturday or Sunday under the direction of the local post of the G.A.R., to which the deceased belonged."
