CIVIL WAR VETERAN ANSWERS FINAL CALL AT KELLNERSVILLE: The dark shadow of death has again claimed another of the few remaining heroes of the Civil War, last Thursday morning when Mr. Anton Malley, aged 78, the well-known veteran of Kellnersville, passed on to the west, and who was one of the last know veterans of that community. Mr. Malley Voluntarily enlisted in Company G, 39th Regiment of Wisconsin on June 10, 1864 at Manitowoc and was stationed at Camp Washburn under the supreme command of Capt. Aug. Dueno of Manitowoc. He was wounded several times during his volunteered service, and was honorably discharged on the 22nd day of September 1864. Deceased was a native of Bohemia, born on May 20, 1844, coming to this country with his parents when 8 years of age in the year of 1852. He was married to Miss Mary Menchal in the town of Franklin on the 18th day of November 1867, who now mourns his departure. Mr Malley was in good health up to a few years ago when an infection set in his right leg which necessitated the amputation of the same to the knee, in connection with which diabetes claimed him. The funeral took place Saturday morning at the home of his son Joseph at Kellnersville, with whom, he and his wife have made their home since Mr. Malley has retired from farming. He was laid to rest in the National Cemetery of Kossuth with National colors with six grandsons acting as paulbearers. Deceased is survived by his widow, Mrs. Anton Malley, Kellnersville; one daughter, Mrs. George Stradal of Kellnersville; two sons, Joseph of Kellnesville and Anton of Shawano, Wis. The veteran was a



father of the late Adolph Malley of this city who died in 1906, leaving a widow and five children to mourn. Those attending the funeral from out-of-town were Mr. and Mrs Anton Malley and family of Shawano, and Albert, Adolph, Mayme, and Edwin Malley of this city."

Part of letter written by Anton Mally's son Joseph in March 1865: "Anton Mally was born in Bohemia in Europe 20 day of May 1844. In 1864 he enlisted in the army civil war and was discharged in 1865 disabled due to Malaria which bothered him for many years after + on the 18th day of November 1867 he married Miss Mary Menchal at Cooperstown by Justice of Peace Wenzel Maresh. There were 4 children in the family, 3 boys and 1 girl."
