Wounded: 22 May 1863 at Vicksburg, MS

Der Nord Westen, 13 June 1901: "Henry Michel, of Manitowoc Rapids, veteran of the Civil War who has been mentally ill for many years, had to be transferred to the state mental facility in Oshkosh on Friday. His condition had worsened such that he required close supervision."
