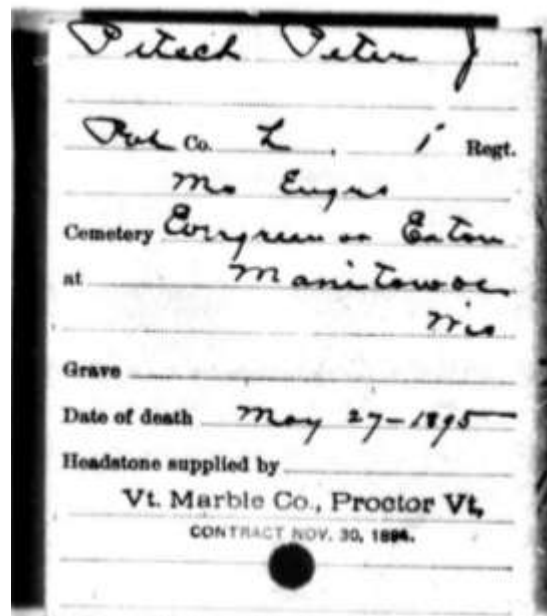

Der Nord Westen, 30 May 1895: "Death on Mon. of John P. Pitsch, a well-known citizen of our city, after a long illness with a liver condition. The deceased, who was born 17 June 1838 in Bidingen, Kreis Merzig, Trier, formerly lived in Newton but for the last many years had a store here on the corner of Main and Marshall Streets. He is survived by his widow and three grown children. The burial took place yesterday. The funeral service was conducted at the local Catholic Church, following which the casket was taken to Newton and buried in St. Peter's Cemetery and was buried next
