

**Johann Fridrich Schramm**  
**U. S. Army Rifles, Company B**  
**58th NY Infantry, Company H**

Born: April 30, 1832, Mossin in Pommern

Immigrated: 28 August 1854 at age 21 from Hamburg, Germany aboard ship *Humboldt*, departed Prussia, arrived Port of New York

Enlisted: September 28, 1861 as a Private at New York City; 28 years old

Transferred into: 48th NY Infantry, Company H on November 23, 1861

Hospitalized: February 15, 1864 at Bridgeport, AL

No record after June, 1864

Married: October 21, 1873 to Elisabeth Sieker, First German Evangelical Lutheran Church, Manitowoc, WI. Elisabeth, 1844-1925

Der Nord Westen, 21 May 1908: "Death Friday in Manitowoc Rapids of John Schramm, a veteran of the Civil War who settled in Rapids at war's end and has lived there ever since. During the war he served with the 58th New York Infantry Regiment and participated in all of its battles. He is survived by a widow and several children. His funeral was held Monday from the local Lutheran Church."
