Born: 1831 in Rheidt, Rheinpreussen

Emigrated: 1847 from Germany; settled in Newton.

Drafted: September 30, 1864 as a Private from Newton, WI

Johann P./Stuempges/1831-1911

"History of Manitowoc County Wisconsin", by Dr. L. Falge, 1911-1912, v.2, p.49-50, part of son Herman Stuempges bio. "John P. and Sophie Stuempges, who emigrated to the United States from Germany. Upon their arrival in this country in 1847, they first located at Newton, Wisconsin, where the father engaged in farming. Later he withdrew from agricultural pursuits and engaged in the operation of a sawmill and he also sold trees. He was always loyal in his allegiance to the land of his adoption and served as a private in the Twenty-seventh Wisconsin Regiment during the Civil war, being honorably discharged at the close of hostilities. Both he and his wife passed their latter years in Manitowoc, the mother's death occurring in 1888, and the father's on the 28th of March, 1911. They were buried in Evergreen cemetery."
