

**Ferdinand Veith**  
**45th WI Infantry, Company D**

Born: February 14, 1838 in Bohemia

Immigrated 1856: Ferdinand.Veith, b 1838 Bohemia, Port of Entry: New York in Dec 1856. Intent filed: 5 Apr 1858

Enlisted: February 15, 1865 as a Private, from Manitowoc, WI, 37 year-old Shoemaker, 5'8", blue eyes, dark hair.

Mustered Out: May 29, 1865

1875-76 Manitowoc City Directory: Ferd Veith, brick yard corner 20th & Franklin, resides Main south of Washington

1880 Federal Census: WI, Manitowoc County, Manitowoc Ward 1:  
Ferdinan Veith, 52, Married, Brickmaker, b Oestria (Austria)

Der Nord Westen, 31 May 1888: Death of Mrs. Katharine Veith, on Mon. She was the wife of Ferdinand Veith, a resident of the 3rd Ward. The deceased had been ill since Christmas and one might consider her death as a release from a terrible disease. The funeral was yesterday.

Der Nord Westen, 25 June 1903: "Death Sat. of Ferdinand Veith, Sr., in the Veterans Home in Milwaukee. The deceased was born in Germany in 1825 and came to America in 1852. During the war he served in Company 'D' of the 45th Regiment, but was hospitalized shortly after entering service. His body was brought here and the funeral was held Tues. from the residence of his son, Supervisor Ferd. Veith, Jr."
